Problem Encountered and Resource Required

Fortunately no problems are encountered in the implementation of this Best Practice. The college has the fund from CPE to implement any new practice.

“A Professional Agency is hired to groom and train the students.”

The Goals:

- To improve employability of our students.
- To train the students in various skills like communication skills, Personality Development, Public Speaking, Interview Skills etc.
- To enhance the self esteem and confidence level of our students.

The Context:

In keeping with the call of “Skill India,” we decided to train our students in various skills to make them confident and employable. The students learn various skills before they leave the institution with the degrees.

The Practice:

The institution has hired professional trainers “**Career Clinic, Career Management Institute**”, to train 50 to 60 students each year. The students are selected in the beginning of the year and the agency trains them in modules throughout the year. After completion of the training, they are taken out



in the fieldwork for practical experience of what they have learnt. At the end of the course the agency measures the achievement of the students and the participants are give certificates.

Evidence of Success:

The progress of the participants is meassured from the beginning to the end. In fact more and more students are enthusiastic to join in the course but we have kept the number limited to manageable level. The transformation of the students is an evidence in itself.

Problems Encountered and Resource Required:

So far the training is going on without facing any problem. The college has the CPE grant as the resource for financial requirements.

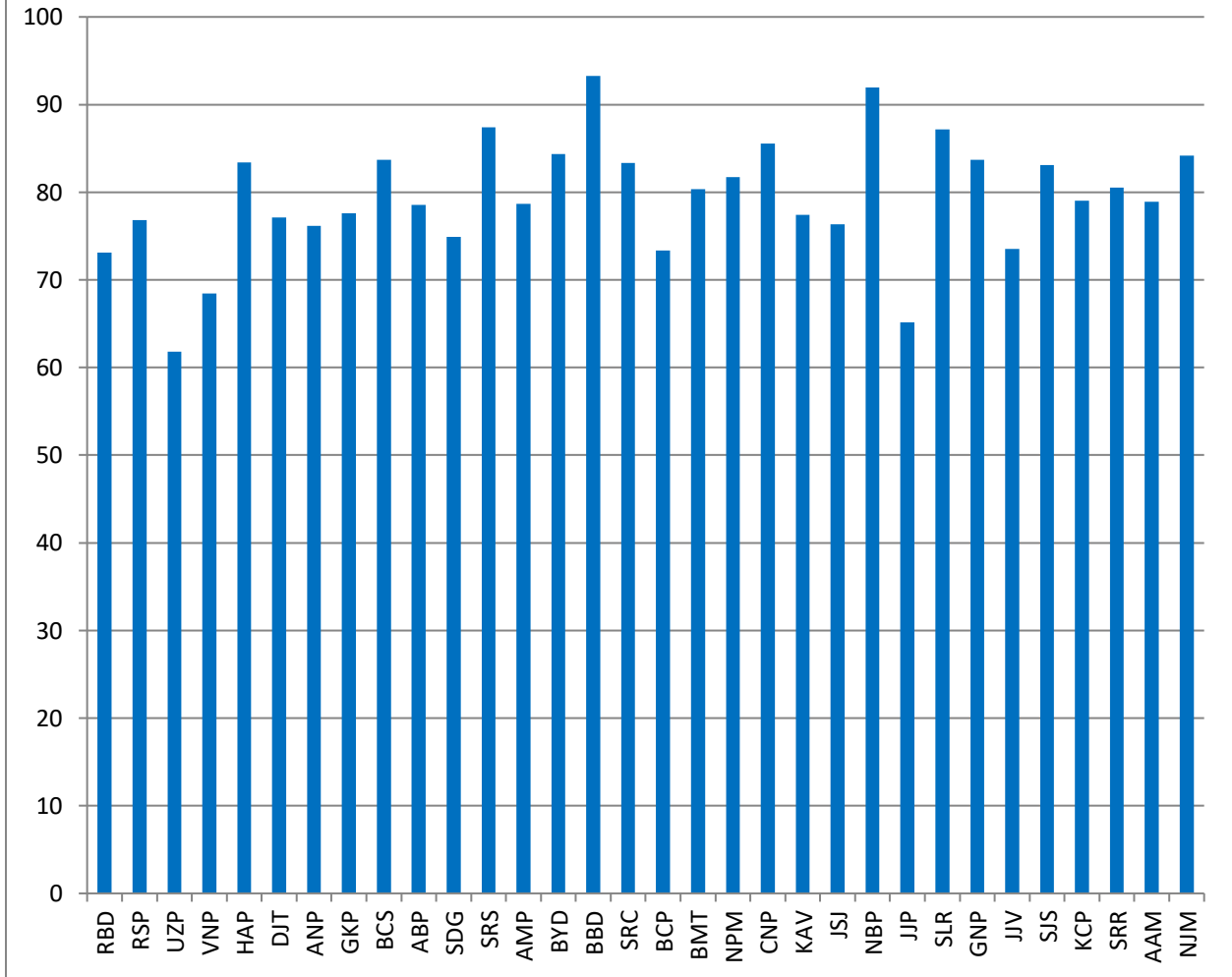

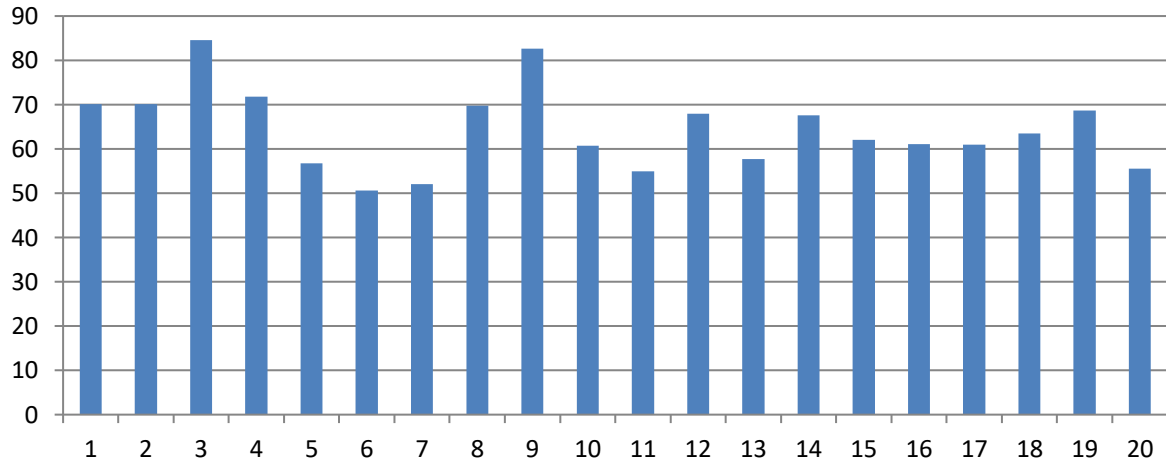

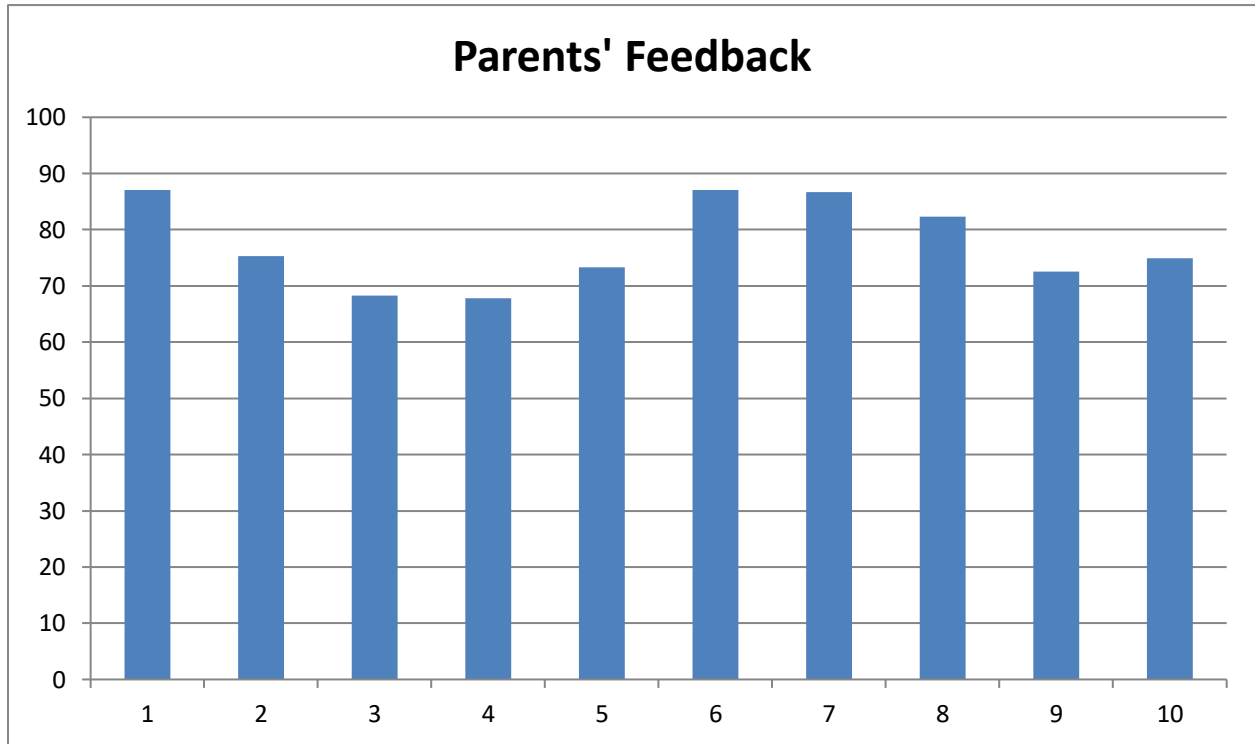
INSTITUTION PERCENTAGE OF STUDENT'S FEED BACK
